

WHAT NEEDS TO BE DONE TO END CHILD TRAFFICKING?



Preventing and ending child trafficking is a shared responsibility. That's why the **United Nations** coordinates a special group called **ICAT: the Inter-Agency Coordination Group Against Trafficking** in Persons', and they came up with a set of recommendations for governments and other organizations.



These recommendations include...



PROSECUTING.

Traffickers need to be brought to justice and pay for their crimes.

Governments should have strong laws and use them to stop traffickers so they don't harm other children. Police and justice systems can help

PROTECTING CHILD VICTIMS OF TRAFFICKING

Children who have been trafficked need to be identified, so they receive the support and protection they need, including access to justice.

They should be seen as victims of crimes, and should never be criminalized or detained. They have to be informed about their rights, including their right to be heard.

PARTNERSHIPS.

Everyone should work together within and across countries. It's everybody's business.
