











Why are children in street situations?





... because street might feel safer than where they were before, for example... children may be running away from violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect.







They are holders of rights. They are children in danger who need protection.

For example, they have the right to:

- Be protected from harm.
- Have a place to live.
- Have healthy meals.
- Receive education.
- Be able to see a doctor when they feel ill.
- Express their views and opinions.

... are NOT criminals.

They are victims because society is failing to provide care, protection, and services for them.



... are taking actions.

They know their reality well and they are taking actions to support one another.



... recognize that ALL children are important and they ALL have a right to grow up in a safe and caring environment. ... make sure ALL children, including children in street situations have access to services like education, health, protection, and justice.



... spend enough resources on fighting poverty and support families to prevent children from being in the street situations. Also, train social workers and have a better system so children in street situations can get better support and re-join their family and community.



... involve children in shaping the responses
