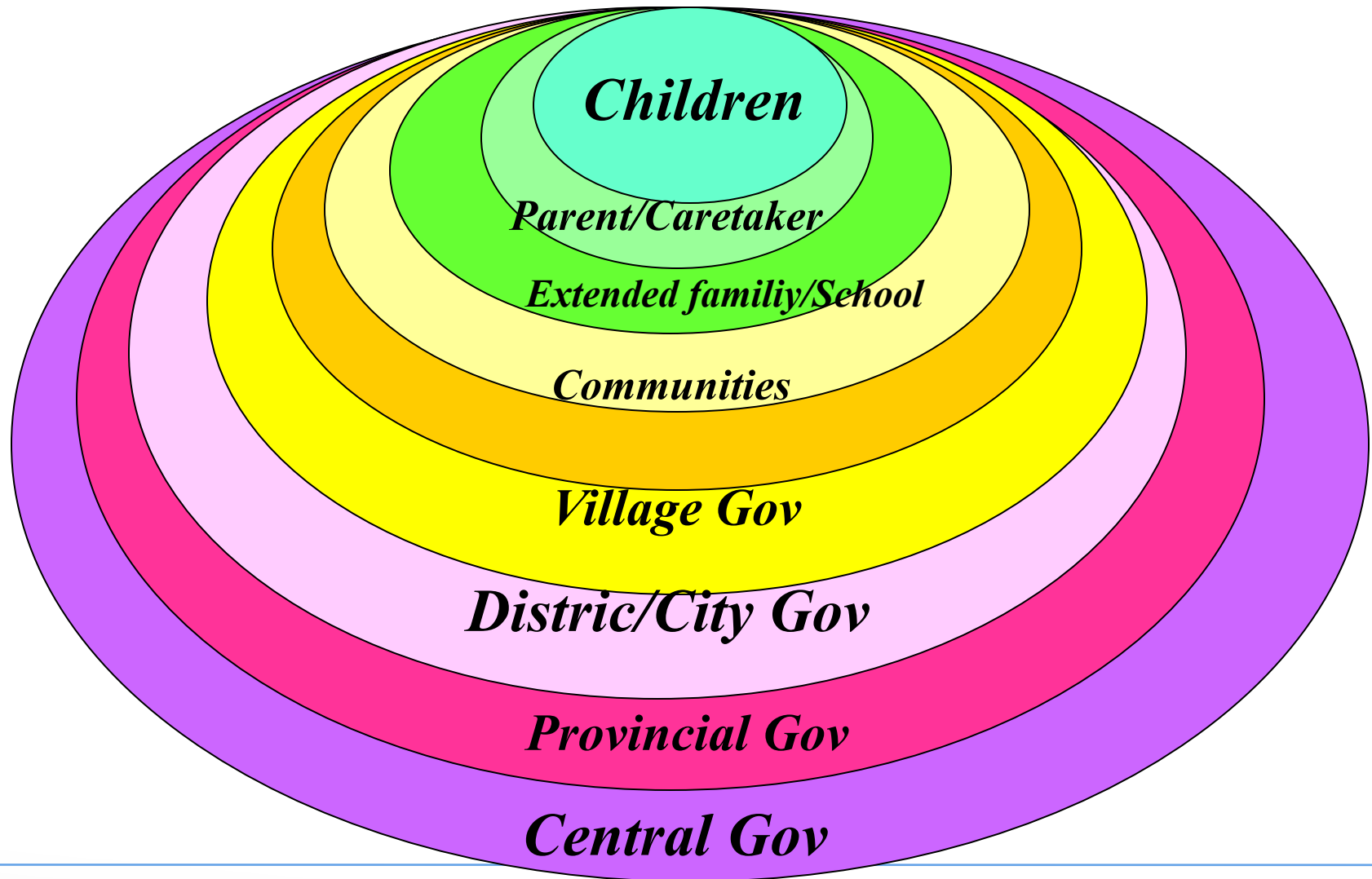

Legal Bases for community participation in Child Protection

- Mid-term National Development Planning 2015 -2019 (focus on prevention and response)
- Law on Regional Government of 2014 (to delegate the authority from central government to local governments on prevention and response to violence against children)
- Law on Village of 2014 (to empower communities)
- MoWECP regulation on Child Participation in Development Policy
- Guideline for child participation in regional development forum.

Child Protection Approach



Follow up

- Identification of best practices of CBCP from Plan, UNICEF, WVI, University, Local Gov and others
- Develop model in 4 provinces:
 - Bengkulu represent Sumatera
 - Bandung represent West Java
 - Jogja represent Middle Java
 - Lombok represent East Nusa Tenggara/East part of Indonesia
- In cooperation with Women Study Center, CSO and local government.

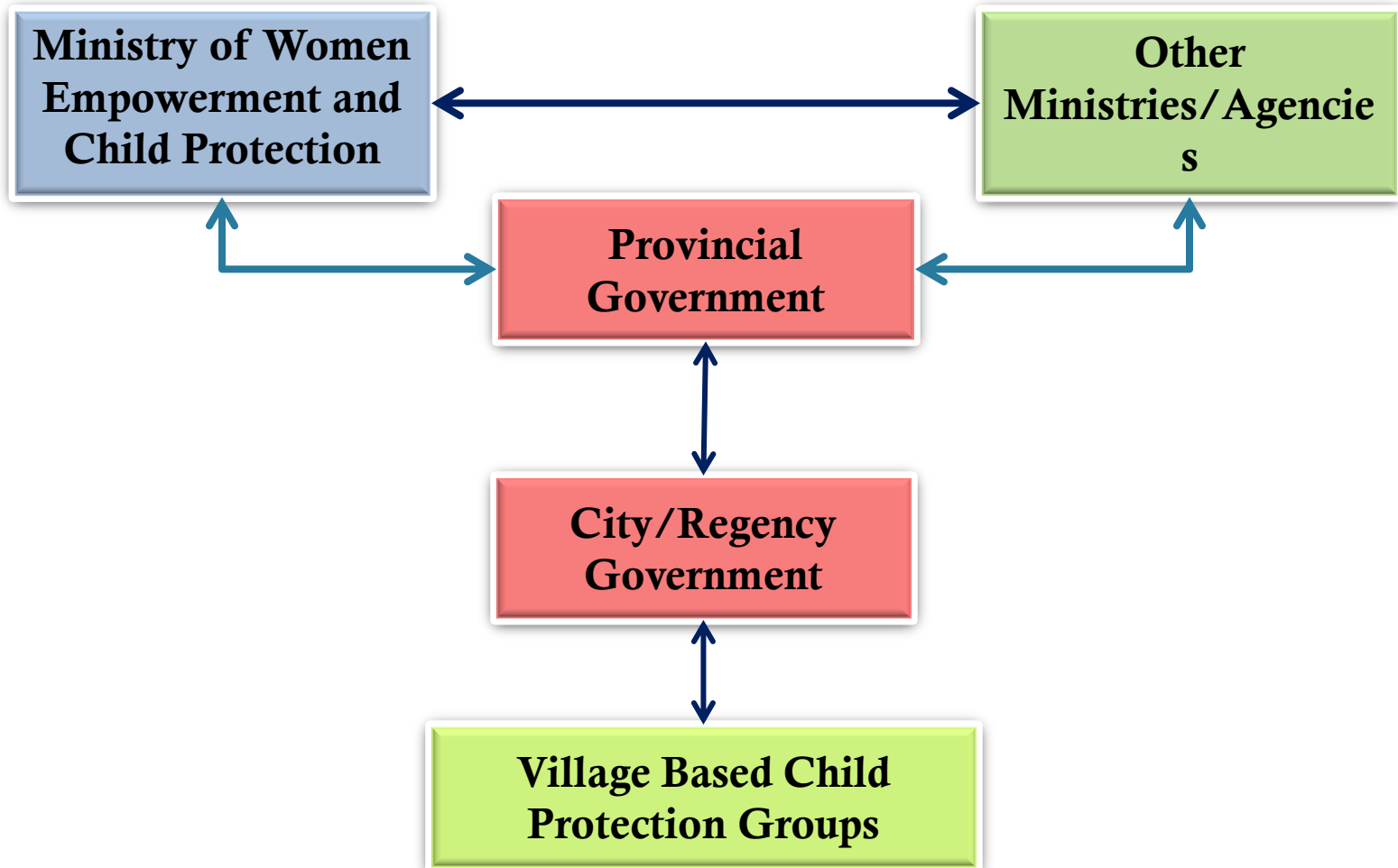
Continue.....

- Establish the coordination mechanism at central level, provincial level and district levels on CBCP
- Establish cooperation with line ministries, communities and NGO for enhancing effectiveness of CBCP
- Develop guidelines related to budgeting on CBCP for regional government.
- Developing cartoon to disseminate the lesson learnt as an instrument of advocacy

Plan Indonesia (Plan Report, 2014)

- There are 280 CBCPMs supported by Plan International Indonesia that reached around 1 million children in 9 Plan working areas.
- Districts/city have developed policy requiring all villages to establish CBCPMs as in one city (Surabaya) and 4 district (Kebumen, Grobogan, Rembang, and Timor Tengah Selatan)
- Plan supported CBCPMs in close cooperation with district and sub-district authorities.
- Linking of CBCPMs with the City Fit For Children (Kota Layak Anak) Initiative has further strengthened CBCPMs
