Middle East and North Africa: Pakistan

Children and teenagers act as Social Ambassadors to conduct research and survey communities within Pakistan. In Pakistan, Kafeel is a campaign that engages community members in creating sustainable measures to break child poverty cycles. For example, the flagship project included data collection of undocumented marriages in districts of Pakistan. Through Kafeel, children whose births are registered through the local Union Council are admitted to learning academies and later on integrated into mainstream governmental schools in accordance with their constitutional right to free education.
