UNODC's Education for Justice Initiative (E4J) has engaged children and young people in multiple ways since the start of the COVID-19, specially during lockdown. Targeting primary level children, E4J launched several competitions over the past months to prompt children to use our tools while stimulating creative skills. The competitions involved the submission of drawings, videos as well as written content reaching thousands of children in Latin America, Central Asia and MENA region.

Justice Accelerators programme aimed at engaging teenagers in developing rule of law solutions using IT and entrepreneurship. This is a 3,5 month programme that equips upper secondary students (16+) with the skills to become social tech entrepreneurs while solving issues related to the rule of law and sustainable development. Since its recent launch, the programme has reached 48 young people.
